General remarks:

Teacher education abroad, especially in Ireland and the UK, is organised very differently from Austria. Our Erasmus+ agreements are with English and Linguistics Departments, but not with Teacher Education colleges. For this reason, usually only literature, cultural studies and linguistics courses (plus electives) can be replaced by comparable modules abroad.

For Teacher Education students going abroad, the recognized ECTS from all areas of their studies will be accepted by the International Office will be accepted: both subjects and education/pedagogy.

Theoretically, this is good news; in practice, things depend on whether students can find and be admitted to suitable modules in their second subject and in pedagogy/education.

THEREFORE: B.Ed. students wishing to do Erasmus: SAVE YOUR 10 ECTS Electives!

The other VK can be completed abroad. The VK topic needs to have relevance for future teachers: VK Linguistics should deal with topics as bi/multilingualism, classroom language, Second Language Acquisition, Digital Discourse (see U:Find for further examples) VK Cultural Studies or Literature should deal with topics relevant to young adults. These courses do have a didactics bias, but are not strictly speaking didactics course.

In the UK and in Ireland modules tend to be bigger than in Vienna (modules have 7.5, 10 or even 15 ECTS), which will limit the number of modules you will be able to select and makes recognition more difficult. Big modules will usually be split between a mandatory course and Electives.

Currently, Mag. Monika Wittmann is still responsible for all questions relating to the recognition of modules completed during exchange semesters.
